We prepared a few useful tips how to design on the dieline.

Layers

PACKHELP TIPS

Layer containing our Tips & Recommendations (feel free to hide)

YOUR DESIGN

This is layer where your project should be placed (please DO NOT delete this layer)

SAMPLE DESIGN

A design of a tissue paper we have prepared to show you how to properly place your design below our dieline. We recommend to use it as a reference when dealing with bleeds, margins and cut lines. (feel free to hide)

PRINTABLE AREA

The whole sheet of tissue paper with the printable area indicated maximum printable area within which all your graphics should be contained.

BACKGROUND TYPES

This layer includes all the available colours of the background.

Print

One-sided print

- The print is performed on one side of the sheet

Print colours

- Use PANTONE colours on the sheet of tissue paper

Non-standard print

- If you wish to include other colours from PANTONE than the available ones, please visit our Packhelp Pro website <https://packhelp.com/pro>

The density of print

- The whole percentage of the graphic design shouldn't cover more than 20% of the sheet

Step by step

1. First, please get familiar with our tips and - most importantly - our specification on the right.

2. We kindly ask you not to remove layers TISSUE PAPER TYPES and PRINTABLE AREA. Hiding them is fine!

3. Place your design within the layer YOUR DESIGN. Remember to include a margin of 5 mm between the edge of your sheet and your designed imprint.

4. Make sure that your colour of imprint is one from the PANTONE range.

5. Once your design is ready, please save your file to one of the format recommended by us (AI, EPS, PDF).

6. Upload the prepared file in the editor to create an order.

Print area

Use this dieline to place your design on the tissue paper. Remember to keep your design within the maximum printable area.

Our Requirements

Please make sure that your design meets our specification. These specifications have been prepared and tested by us, in order to guarantee both quality and speed of the production process of your bags.

Text

Keep text at 6pt (2,12 mm) or higher.

Colours in use

Use colours from the Pantone palette, except for neon and metallic colours.

Convert text to outlines

Converting text to outlines means less issues in rare case we needed to open your files.

Pictures and illustrations

Bitmaps (images) should be vectorized in Pantone separation, without gradients.

Graphic

Please use vector-graphics, with 100% colour coverage, no transparency, 100% opacity and no gradients. Please convert texts to vectors (outline texts).

Careful when saving PDFs

After you convert your text to outlines it's fairly easy to save your file and lose ability to edit outlined text. Whenever exporting your files, always make sure you're creating copies.

Lines

Our lines should be at least 0.3 pt (0.1 mm) wide.

Number of colours

We're printing one colour per side. It's possible to have different colours on each side.

Graphic files

We're accepting vector files - AI, EPS, PDF.

White colour

White Pantone colour usage is possible on a non-white material.

Embed all files

Please make sure that all files are embedded instead of being linked.
